JACKSON PURCHASE RIFLE & PISTOL CLUB
Meeting Minutes For July 20, 2009

CALL TO ORDER: The monthly meeting of the Jackson Purchase Rifle & Pistol Club was called to order at 6:47pm, on July 20, 2009 at Paducah Shooters Supply, with Mike Jones presiding.

INTRODUCTION OF GUESTS: None present.

APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MEETING'S MINUTES: Club meeting minutes from June were not available.

REVIEW OF FINANCIAL REPORTS: Phyllis McCutchen was not present, however she sent in her report which Richard Roof read.

Richard Roof reported that the Club investment account gained back approximately \$4,000 in May, 2009 but lost about \$100 in June. A motion was made to accept the financial reports by Glen Newtown, seconded by Mike Marshall and passed by the membership.

CONTINUING BUSINESS:

Officers' Activity Reports: Mike Marshall reported a light turnout for the June PPC Match, but a better turnout for the July Match (9 shooters). Mike also reported there are weeds on Range 1 and that the Range is generally in pretty bad shape. There are also some large weeds between the Stat House and Range 1. The trash on Range 1 and the Public Range is becoming a problem and the use of the Public Range has fallen off from what it was earlier in the year.

Glen Newtown did not have anything to report.

Lee Miller checked on the cost of a new PA system for both the Range 1 & 3. The amplifiers would be housed inside the respective Rifle & Pistol sheds with microphone jacks located outside near the center of the firing lines. The total systems would consist of 2 amps, 2 mics, 4 speakers, wiring, jacks, & plugs. The estimated cost for the equipment would run about \$1,000 from Hughes Electronics. Richard Roof offered the suggestion of looking into a wireless PA system similar to the one he just bought for the airport. The company Richard got his system from is out of Kevil and would probably be a little more expensive than the one Lee was looking at. Lee said he would look into it. Lee also reported he had just repaired one of the microphones to the current PA again for the umpteenth time.

Lee Miller reported the Cowboy Action Match had 10 shooters with some from as far

away as Chicago and Tennessee. Lee also stated there was a growing trash problem on the Pistol Range. He also said some of the Hi-Power Rifle shooters that he invited down to the Pistol Range for lunch actually did come down and get some of his lunch that he had fixed for the Cowboys. (It was good).

Gary Lambert reported that the billing for printing and mailing the Newsletter will be split up to capture the cost of printing and mailing separately. He said that it would take about a week to get the Newsletter out once he got the disc to the printers. Everyone will need to plan accordingly. Currently, the last week of the month will be the printing and mailing week. Mike Jones added that the 25th of the month will be the deadline for getting articles into the current month's Newsletter.

Mike Jones also reported on the sale of some of the Club rifles and the Charity Match coming up August 8th and 9th.

David Langston reported that the first Junior Match for this year on June 27th had a light turnout. There was another Match scheduled that same day but he could not recall where. The next Match will be August 8th & 9th as Mike Jones had stated earlier, and a lunch will be available.

No reports from Bench Rest or Big Bore Pistol.

Mike Jones reported on his Combat Pistol / Steel Plate Match.

George Reynolds reported that the July Hi-Power Rifle Match had 12 shooters, the firing line was full. The weather was much better for the Hi-Power Match this month than for the Vintage Match. Some of the shooters accepted Lee Miller's invitation for lunch which was very good, (no wonder Lee generally has a good turnout). The Match winner was Don McRoy from Dexter, MO. Don shot a high master score, with Buzz Lindstrom from the Chicago area coming in first in the expert class. The next Hi-Power Rifle Match will be the third Saturday in August, with the last 2 Matches reverting back to the 2nd Saturday of both September and October.

Rick Emerson reported on the Vintage Match. The main part of his report was RAIN, RAIN, and more RAIN. Rick had a 2 1/2 hour rain delay at the start of his Match. The 10:00 relay finally got started about 12:30. There was not a 2nd relay. Rick Reichert won the Bolt Rifle category, Bobby Hoffmann won the Vintage Rifle category, and Tripp Gilson won the Modern Rifle category. The last 3 Vintage Matches will be back on the 1st Saturday of the month for August through October.

Rick Emerson also reported on the Club Rifle sales. The bid sheets will be at the Registration Office Building on the Public Range, which is opened from 1 to 5 pm Saturdays & Sundays. There will be 2 days when the Rifles will be available for inspection on the Public Range, 8-8-09 and 9-19-09. The bids will be closed at 5 pm on Sunday, September 20, 2009 and the winning bids will be announced the follow-

ing evening during the Club meeting.

Bill Allen reported on the Friends of NRA Banquet. The date for the Banquet is 8-27-09 at the Robert Cherry Civic Center. The food will be catered by Backwoods BBQ. Banquet tickets will be \$30, with raffle tickets available for several guns selling for \$20 each. Only 100 tickets per gun will be available. Currently the raffle guns are a matched set of left and right hand Ruger Vaquero and a DPMS AR 15.

David Langston reported in the 4-H Charity Match scheduled for Saturday & Sunday 8-8-09 and 8-9-09. The Rifle portion will be shot with BB, Air, & .22s; the Pistol portion will be shot with Air & .22s. There will also be a sport and precision category for Air & .22s for both Pistol and Rifle. There will also be a PPC Match from 9-4 on Saturday and 10-3 on Sunday. The PPC Match will be restricted to Revolvers and Semi-Automatics. Steel Plates and Bowling Pins will be available as well as Trap for the shotguns. Re-shoots will be available for all Matches. The Matches are open to both adults and juniors, with awards given for 1st in individual categories.

NEW BUSINESS:

Other: Mike Marshall reported that due to the damage being sustained by the Club golf cart, the Big Bore Silhouette Match personnel will be allowed to bring their private 4 wheeler onto the Rifle Range to distribute and set up their steel targets. This exception does not apply to anyone else.

Gary Lambert has bids for the landscaping fabric from Lowe's & Home Depot and bids for gravel from several contractors including one from Lynn McCutchen. The gravel is to be installed on the Rifle Range road and on the Public Pistol Range. The gravel on the Rifle Range road is to be 3 inches deep, by 8 feet wide. The new Range road will follow the remnants of the existing road down the right side of the Rifle Range, starting at the rollup door of the Rifle shed and end at the 200 yard line with two side roads attached. The side roads will also follow the existing side roads with one in front of the 100 yard line, the other in front of the 200 yard line. Gravel is also to be spread on the Public Pistol Range with landscaping fabric laid down first. Since Lynn's bid was in line with everyone else, a motion was made by Gene Young to let Lynn do the job within a 30 day limit, weather permitting. If Lynn cannot get the job done (complete & inspected) within 30 days, the Club will go with one of the other contractors that bid on the job. A maximum of \$2,500 was allowed by the Club for the job. The motion was seconded by Glen Newtown and passed by voice vote.

Approval Payment of Bills: There were no new bills to be approved.
